Progress 8	<p>Progress 8 aims to capture the progress a student makes from the end of primary school (Year 6) to the end of secondary school (Year 11). It is a type of value added measure, which means that students' results are compared to the actual achievements of other students with similar prior attainment across the country.</p> <p>Progress 8 scores will be centred around 0, with most schools within the range of -1 to +1:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A score of 0 means students in this school on average do about as well at KS4 as those with similar prior attainment nationally. • A positive score means students in this school on average do better at KS4 as those with similar prior attainment nationally. • A negative score means students in this school on average do worse at KS4 as those with similar prior attainment nationally. 	+0.07	A score of +0.07 means that our 2020-21 Year 11 students achieved slightly better than their Year 11 counterparts with similar characteristics across the country.
<p>The English Baccalaureate (EBacc)</p> <p>Entry Percentage</p>	<p>The EBacc is a set of subjects (identified and stipulated by the Government) at GCSE that keeps students' options open for further study and future careers.</p> <p>The EBacc is made up of the study of the following subjects:</p> <p>English Language and English Literature Maths The Sciences (Biology, Chemistry, Physics) Geography or History A Modern Foreign Language (French, Spanish, German)</p> <p>Secondary schools are measured on the number of students that take GCSEs in these core subjects. Schools are also measured on how well their students perform in these subjects. The EBacc is classified as a performance measure for schools, not a qualification for students.</p>	16%	<p>The percentage number of students who undertook qualifications in all the following subjects:</p> <p>English Language and English Literature Maths The Sciences (Biology, Chemistry, Physics) Geography or History A Modern Foreign Language (French, Spanish, German)</p>

The English Baccalaureate (EBacc) Average Points Score	<p>Each qualification grade is assigned a points score that is used to calculate the EBacc Average Points Score.</p> <p>To calculate a school's EBacc average point score, the Department for Education (DfE):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Adds together the EBacc average point score for all students at the end of Key Stage 4 - Divides by the number of students in the overall Year 11 cohort <p>To calculate a student's Average Points Score we take an average of the points scored in the 5 EBacc subject areas. These individual Average Point Scores are not published.</p>	3.79	<p>The EBacc is made up of the subjects which are considered essential to many degrees and open doors for a variety of possible next steps.</p> <p>Research shows that a student's socio-economic background impacts the subjects they choose at GCSE, and that this determines their opportunities beyond school (UCL: 2019).</p>

English & Maths Grade 5 (Strong Pass) Percentage Measure	Measures the percentage of students who have achieved a Grade 5 or higher in both Maths and an English qualification (English Language or English Literature)	41.1%	
Attainment 8	Attainment 8 measures the achievement of a student across 8 qualifications including Maths (double weighted) and English (double weighted), 3 further qualifications that count in the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) measure and 3 further qualifications that can be GCSE qualifications (including EBacc subjects) or any other non-GCSE qualifications on the DfE approved list. Each individual grade a student achieves is assigned a point score, which is then used to calculate a student's Attainment 8 score	46.58	This figure suggests that the average Grade within the 2020-21 Year 11 cohort was a Grade 5 (Strong Pass).
