

Community Engagement

We recognise that parents play a vital role in supporting students to achieve their potential and encourage parents to work closely with staff.

As a school we provide effective and efficient communications to ensure that parents and carers are involved in all aspects of school life.

We use parent mail as our main method of contact but also provide monthly newsletters and updates via social media platforms.

Parent and Carers Advisory Board (PCAB)

The Parent and Carers Advisory Board provides a vital link between home, the school and the trust board and sets to strengthen parental voice. So far, PCAB has supported the school in developing its Relationships for Learning Policy and a new Communications Policy.

Via our Facebook page we share important information and gain feedback on events, such as parent consultations. This helps in the planning of further such events and how these are best run going forward in order to meet the needs of parents/carers.

We hold regular 'drop-in' sessions for parents, covering a variety of topics, such as school uniform and homework.

The current board have an exceptional range of expertise, such as teachers, those with special educational needs experience, legal and procurement communications backgrounds.

As the school grows, we aim to appoint additional parental/carer representation to ensure each year group has parental/carer voice.

Friends of RFSS is a voluntary parents and carers and friends group which provides support to the school at key events, fund raising and runs the second-hand uniform shop.





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Safeguarding

RFSS is committed to safeguarding and promotes the welfare of children and young people, expecting all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. The safety and welfare of our staff and students is of paramount importance to all those involved in education. We have a team of Designated Safeguarding Leads who are responsible for leading on safeguarding. However, students can and do form positive relationships with school staff and will at times view them as significant and trustworthy adults. We encourage students to talk to staff about anything that worries them and staff will always act in the best interest of students. We also use an online platform in order to raise concern or seek advice



Each year group has a Head of Year who is a full time teacher and an Assistant Head of Year (non- teaching) supporting this role. There are also Form Tutors in each year group who meet with their class each morning for registration and who deliver a Form Tutor programme throughout the year that covers all areas of PSHCE and creates opportunities for celebrating success.

This structure also means that students and parents have three dedicated points of contact for their specific year group which allows for regular contact between school and home via phone, email or prearranged meetings. It also reinforces the school value of Collaboration as we all seek to work in partnership for the benefit of your child.



Equal Opportunities and Diversity

We recognise our moral and statutory responsibility to safeguard and promote the welfare of all students. All students, regardless of age, gender, ability, culture, race, language, religion or sexual identity, have equal rights to protection. We endeavour to provide a safe and welcoming environment where children are respected and valued. We are alert to the signs of abuse and neglect, exploitation or radicalisation and follow our procedures to ensure that children receive effective support, protection and justice.

SEND

Rugby Free Secondary School is committed to providing a positive and engaging learning experience for all students.

In the SEND department, we develop individual and tailored support to build resilience and ensure that every child has equal access to the diverse opportunities our school offers.

Our SENCo is a strong advocate of an inclusive and respectful culture, lead a committed team. Teaching Assistants provide in-class support, small group and 1:1 interventions across a range of areas including Literacy, Numeracy and Social Skills.

Our commitment to you and your child:

- Regular contact with the SEND team including meetings to set and review your child's targets
- Monitoring of your child's progress and feeding this back to you
- Co-production with you and your child of a Pupil
 Centred Plan that is shared with all teachers
- A supportive, positive and collaborative relationship with you and your child

Disadvantaged Students

We firmly believe that the financial circumstances of our families should in no way limit or prevent students accessing educational opportunities or becoming a barrier to success or inhibiting students from reaching their potential. We therefore provide financial assistance to students in receipt of FSM for extra curricular visits, enrichment opportunities and resources. A member of the Senior Leadership Team has responsibility for monitoring the progress of and development of disadvantaged students.

Learning and Teaching

Our forward-thinking curriculum, designed to meet the needs of all students, equips our young people with the skills they will need to succeed today, whilst also developing the skills they will need to be 'Set for Life', both tomorrow and beyond.

Our highly-skilled and dedicated teachers embrace the latest innovations in teaching and learning, and utilise cutting-edge educational research to ensure that we continually support our students to develop a love of learning to help them become learners for life; developing the powerful knowledge and skills that they will need in the real-world.

In lessons, our students are encouraged to use their thinking skills to build on existing knowledge, to generate their own ideas and opinions, and to solve problems effectively. This philosophy also extends itself to the 'whole student', as we strive to develop well rounded individuals who are respectful, curious and resilient.

At RFSS, students have regular opportunities to discuss their academic progress with their teachers, students' knowledge and skills are then assessed at regular intervals throughout the academic year. Outside of the classroom, students are expected to complete homework to build on what they are learning in lessons.


