

- The role and power of individual states (federalism)

Task 2... Consider any one president of the USA between 1945 and 1980. To what extent do you approve of his record whilst President? Create a chart/table to organise your research. Should be done as a table, with two headings (I approve, I disapprove) to organise you evidence.
